“ Edward was a friend during my teen years, from his then-interest in science fiction. I was flattered that he invited me to be his guest at a family celebration of his Fourth of July birthday... apparently there having been a tradition of him inviting just one friend! It was followed by attendance at a baseball double-header at Memorial Stadium between the Orioles and, as I recall, the Cleveland Indians. Edward was annoyed at how badly the Orioles were losing -- and at a Hispanic player for the Indians who hit four homers that day. "Why don't you go back to Cuba!" he shouted, only to get a tap on the shoulder from a very large man with a cigar who had been sitting behind us -- and, in a Spanish-tinged accent, gave Edward a quick lecture on the meaning of Independence Day. Even more memorable was that I was sitting next to Edward's sister Alice, and we bonded in laughter at what had just happened. We became friends that day. And that connection -- which lasts until this very day -- was because of Edward. I am sad that I did not keep in touch with Edward over the years, as our lives took very different paths. Oddly, Alice met her now-former husband, the late Jay Haldeman, through the science fiction connection, and their daughter eventually became the step-sister of my first daughter. I think of that as among the ripples that started with Edward's generosity in seeing me as a friend, and affected future lives. I am grateful to him for that, and offer my condolences to the family.
