Michael S. Tsimis passed away on August 12, 2025, at the age of 90. Michael was born on August 10, 1935, to the late Stephen M. Tsimis and Sotiria M. Tsimis (née Kambanopoulos). He was predeceased by his sister, Eugenia H. Tsimis.

A graduate of the Maryland School for the Deaf in Frederick, MD, Michael went on to study and graduate from the Maryland Institute College of Art. He was a skilled artist and an avid collector of Lionel trains.

Michael's professional journey started with him working in his father's Baltimore hair salon and later retiring from the United States Postal Service. Michael never lost his love for learning and stayed informed about current events, always keeping an eye on the news and financial markets.

Michael was a faithful member of The Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Annunciation. His philanthropic efforts were many, and he generously donated to various charities, particularly those benefiting children, animals, and his church.

Michael's warm personality made him a beloved figure among his many friends. He was a social man who loved to tell stories and engage with others. He had a love of animals, especially cats, and he found joy in the simple

moments, including taking day trips to places near the water where he would feed the ducks and geese.

Michael touched many lives, and he is survived by many loving cousins and special friends.

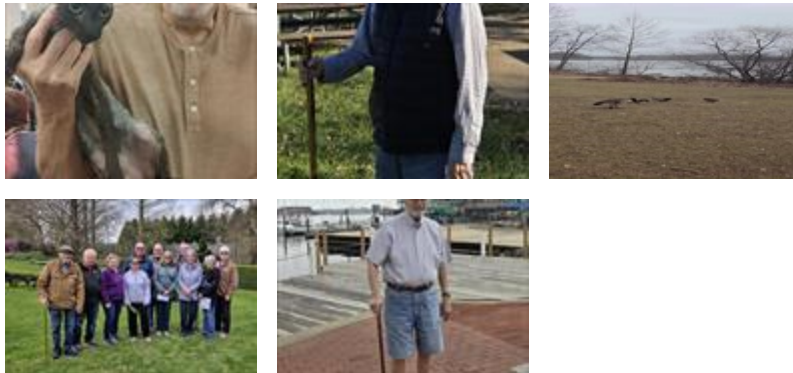
