When I was a toddler in Maryland, they would come visit us and babysit when my parents went out. They would sometimes get us candy and fun things to do, like TNT Pop-Its. You would throw them on the ground, and they would make loud snapping noises. My Aunt Rosemary was the one who first introduced those to me.

We would make monkey noises and gestures, often during photos. I thought her making monkey sounds was the funniest thing, and I’d always ask to do that when Paige and I were kids.

When I went to summer camp at River Valley Ranch, Rosemary, Cheryl, and my mom spent the day with us during drop-off. They hung out with me while I packed my stuff up in the cabin, made my bed, and walked around the campus before the organized activities began. We have photos of us doing the monkey faces outside the dining hall as well.

Those visits were a regular occurrence throughout the 2010's. Then 2020 happened.

With everybody staying at home, and travel becoming more seldom, we started calling each other more regularly. Rosemary and I would talk once or multiple times a month from sometime in 2020 until about May of 2023. We would talk about everything: life events, stories of her childhood in New York, music, and just about anything else we wanted to. We would regularly be on the phone for hours at

a time, upwards of two to three hours per call. I appreciated that she always wanted to talk, and we definitely got closer during that time.

Like many others who knew her, I will miss her terribly. She was a close family member growing up, and I have many fond memories of her. My prayers are with Cheryl, Dave, and everyone else knew had the pleasure of knowing her.
